Good Evening,

Courteous Canines' Unleashed! Day Camp has been following the news coverage on the Atypical Canine InfecAous Respiratory Disease (aCIRD), closely and have consulted with our Veterinarian and are following the guidance of the state Veterinarian.

aCIRD has posed the largest threat to dogs in shelters due to their incomplete vaccinaAon status and higher stress levels. NaAonwide it has spread among a very small number of dogs. aCIRD began circulaAng in the late summer and early autumn of 2022.

In an abundance of cau, on, Unleashed! Day Camp is asking:

• That dogs who are returning from boarding kennels quaranAne at home for the 7 days following the conclusion of their boarding.

• Dogs are only enrolled in daycare at Unleashed! Day Camp and are not aNending and other daycares or parAcipaAng in any other off leash other group play environments. • Dogs enrolled in our Unleashed! Day Camp are not allowed to aNend any dog parks to protect our groups health.

- We are asking clients to schedule holiday grooming appointments as close to December 24th as possible so that your dogs can uAlize the holiday break December 22nd to January 1st to quaranAne.
 - If your groomer allows dogs to interact within the grooming shop (not crated individually) your dog will need to quaranAne for 7 days aUer your appointment before returning to camp.

Current plan to decrease the risk of transmission for our clients:

- This fall we acquired top of the line air purifiers. We have two units set up in the Unleashed! Day Camp. Our purifiers are rated to filter double the square footage of our building. This purifier has been the #1 Rated medical-grade air purifier, and has a HyperHEPA filtraAon which is tested and cerAfied by an independent third-party lab to efficiently filter harmful ultrafine polluAon parAcles including COVID, and the virus that transmits Kennel Cough.
- We will conAnue screening clients' medical records.
- We will be bringing home all kongs to be sterilized in my dishwasher. Clients are welcome to bring their own if they would like.
- Water dishes will be washed hourly.
- We will not be allowing dogs to use toys during free play unAl the threat of respiratory illness transmission has passed.
- Weather permi^ng we will be playing outside as much as possible. Please send your pups with coats and sweaters if needed.

We are asking for clients to assist us in keeping everyone safe by:

- We ask clients to monitor and self-report if their dog has exhibited any of the following symptoms:
 - Coughing that has persisted over mulAple days/weeks
 - o Fever
 - o Eye or Nose Discharge
 - o Sneezing
 - o Letharagy
 - o Difficulty Breathing
 - Loss of AppeAte
- If the dog has ongoing symptoms (longer than 2 days), owners need to be evaluated by their veterinarian before returning to our Unleashed! Day Camp.
- If we observe dogs exhibiAng syptoms they will be isolated and sent home and will need to be cleared by their veterinarian before returning to camp.

We recommend that clients consult with their veterinarians and ensure their dogs are vaccinated for all respiratory disease that are currently iden7fied. All campers are required and current on their Bordetella Vaccina7on.

Owners can discuss if their veterinarian recommends Parainfluenza and Canine Influenza for your dog in addi7on to recommended core vaccines.

The University of New Hampshire's Veterinary DiagnosAc Laboratory and the Hubbard Center for Genome Studies have idenAfied the pathogen, from samples of dogs that were ill in Rhode Island and MassachuseNs. The pathogen is a small bacterium, which is likely to have evolved from a component of the dog microbiome. This informaAon was shared to guide treatment for the respiratory syndrome outbreaks. Currently doxycycline is showing to be effecAve. <u>Rhode</u> <u>Island and MassachuseNs that has reported a total of 40 dogs ill</u>, and New Hampshire has reported 30 dogs' total.

Please discuss your pets' individual exposure levels and risks with your veterinarian. If your dog has immunosuppression issues, please reach out to your veterinarian as your pet has a greater risk.

Please let us know if you have any quesAons or will be absent from your dogs scheduled days.
